PASTOR'S ADDRESS

The Holy Spirit is Calling

Dear Bethanians,

For the past few months, I have had the delightful experience of sharing coffee and conversation with Pastor Erin Grayson, imagining together what it might mean to bring her considerable gifts for pastoral ministry to the Bethany staff and congregation. After months of our joy in this conversation, now is the time for you to share in the excitement and common ministry.

Pastor Erin is a familiar personality on Bainbridge Island. I have gotten to know her through clergy luncheons and in her leadership with our Interfaith Council. As "Erin the Presbyterian" our paths don't cross denominationally, but our acquaintance has been a wonderful product of the Interfaith climate here, and the full-communion partnership between the ELCA and PCUSA has paved the way for Pastor Erin to be a regular supply preacher at Bethany.

Our conversation began as I was thinking aloud about my desire/need to have more flexibility of schedule, what with a grandson in Iowa, and with Laurie and I having parents we would enjoy visiting more often. You are LOVED! By Pastor Erin Grayson



Dear Bethanians,

To say that I'm grateful to be joining the Bethany ministry team with Pastor Paul would be an understatement. I'm truly overjoyed! Thank you for generously inviting me into the community and for welcoming me so warmly. Your hospitality is the foundation of my Bethany experience, and one that inspires my service as Pastor of Faith Formation.

The way I see it, faith formation is an extension of our communal worship, and includes activities like Christian education, special projects, service to one another, fun activities, fellowship, and more! In a sentence, faith formation is the way we always are becoming disciples. That said, there are many ways our faith can take shape and be deepened in the process!

You are Loved!: Continued

This year, I'd like to present to you a theme that will unite all of our faith formation activities: "You are LOVED!" It's a reminder that we are loved beyond measure by God who sees and knows us just exactly as we are. It also inspires us to reflect that love by caring for our neighbors and all of God's good creation. After all, Jesus reminds us, "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:35)

Our Christian Education programs, beginning Sept 18, will draw from and build on Sunday morning worship. For our children's programming, we'll use Illustrated Ministry's Mini Revolutions, an intergenerational curriculum based on the scripture passages of the day. Sunday school lessons will offer children engaging and age-appropriate questions to help us enter into the story and see its relevance in our lives. Activities, spiritual practices, and prayer will help each person embrace their own "mini revolutions" each week.

Adult Education will be held weekly after Sunday worship. Throughout September and October, we'll enjoy a short video series and discussion by Christian author and activist, Shane Claiborne, entitled ECONOMY OF LOVE: *Creating an Economy of Enough.* Our learning will be enhanced by guest speakers from time-to-time. In November, we'll continue our learning together by exploring the transforming power of gratitude. Advent, beginning on the 27th of November, offers us an opportunity for reflection on the season and takes us right up to the new year.

I hope this little preview gives you a peek into what's being planned–and entices you to come and always become disciples as we grow together in faith! My office hours are Tues-Thurs 9:00am-1:00pm. I hope you'll stop by sometime. I'm looking forward to getting to know you, hearing your ideas, and serving as a disciple with you.

Women's Bible Study Group

What is special about women getting together to explore spiritual issues from a Christian perspective?

The group thanks, Carol, Marlene and Alice for their generous years of service in the Rachel Circle, especially during the COVID pandemic.

Carol will continue to lead the Lutheran World Relief quilting project of the Rachel Circle. Marlene will continue to guide the LWR baby kit project, and Alice will continue to organize donations for the annual LWR school book bag project (400 70 sheet spiral notebooks are among the school items needed).

Calling all would-be landscape designers, gardeners, and problem solvers!

Some time ago (BC - "before covid") a car crashed into the Bethany sign at the main entrance on Finch Rd. That crash and the sign replacement construction that followed ruined the landscaped area in front of the sign. (Yes, it was landscaped. You can still find a few tidbits of the purple blooming ground cover peeking through the dirt around the edges).

Now that the sanctuary interior renovation is well in hand, the Building and Grounds Committee is looking for a person, or persons who would like to take on the challenge of re-landscaping that patch of earth welcoming everyone to Bethany.

Fall is a good time to get plantings established and will coincide with our sanctuary rededication. Plants should be low maintenance, drought tolerant and complement the sign.

In addition, we're open to suggestions for the beds along the cherry tree walk that goes through the center of the parking lot. The ground cover is dead or dying and the area needs something simple and low maintenance to replace it.

Affordable Housing Update

Patience and optimism are the virtues currently needed as Bethany's vision for affordable housing proceeds through the Bainbridge Island City Council. Since May 2021, Bethany has been waiting for COBI to determine an "increased density bonus" as mandated in RCW 36.70A.545, the 2019 statute which requires such a bonus for religious organizations seeking to build affordable housing on their properties. The City Council first referred preparing a draft ordinance to the Planning Commission, but after months of discussion, it could not reach a consensus on how to proceed. Specifically, the thorny issues were the amount of the density bonus to provide to Bethany and whether the draft ordinance should provide that Bethany is a pilot project or apply island-wide. Now, adopting an ordinance has rebounded to the City Council, and it remains in the process of evaluating drafts prepared by staff.

The most recent discussion occurred at a Study Session on August 16. The 20 minutes allocated to a newly revised draft turned into a 100-minute discussion! While a number of differing viewpoints remain, it appears that there is a consensus to adopt an ordinance that treats Bethany as a pilot project and adopts a formula for determining density bonus of approximately 20 homes. The next steps will be for the staff to revise (again!) the draft ordinance for consideration by the City Council, and to schedule a Public Hearing on the draft. Hopefully, these steps will occur in September! Upon adoption, Bethany's Affordable Housing Task Force will need to take steps to begin to address the ordinance's requirements for obtaining necessary permits. Once again, stay tuned!

Sanctuary Project Update

The insulation work is done! The staff is grateful to be back in the building. Next up is drywalling. That work will begin the week of September 12th. Still to come – painting, lighting and carpeting.

THE GREATER CHURCH

2022 Churchwide Assembly

The 2022 Churchwide Assembly of the ELCA took place on August 8-12 in Columbus, Ohio. Gathered under the theme *Embody the Word*, approximately 900 voting members and hundreds of guests and visitors participated in plenary sessions to address legislative matters, hear reports on the work of this church, and worship together. Significant events included the election of Imran Siddiqui, an Asian-American and member of the Southeastern Synod, as Vice President of the ELCA. In addition, a number of important memorials and resolutions were adopted, including a commitment to examine

restructuring of the governance of the church and to create a Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church. Other important actions included a commitment to reconsider of aspects of the social statement "Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust", to encourage deeper engagement with indigenous peoples, and to reduce the carbon footprint of the churchwide organization. In addition to legislative matters, a number of memorable events occurred at the Churchwide Assembly. More than a dozen denominational and interfaith leaders were introduced, and the firm commitment of the ELCA to working with other faiths was highlighted. In a non-legislative session, Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton apologized, on behalf of the ELCA, to the worshipping community of Iglesia Luterana Santa Maria Peregrina in Central California for the abrupt removal of the congregation's pastor on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe by the former bishop of the Sierra Pacific Synod. In addition to the apology, Bishop Eaton plans to visit the congregation and to work together with the synod to address repairing the damaged relationship.

The next Churchwide Assembly will take place in late July/early August in Phoenix, AZ in 2025.
